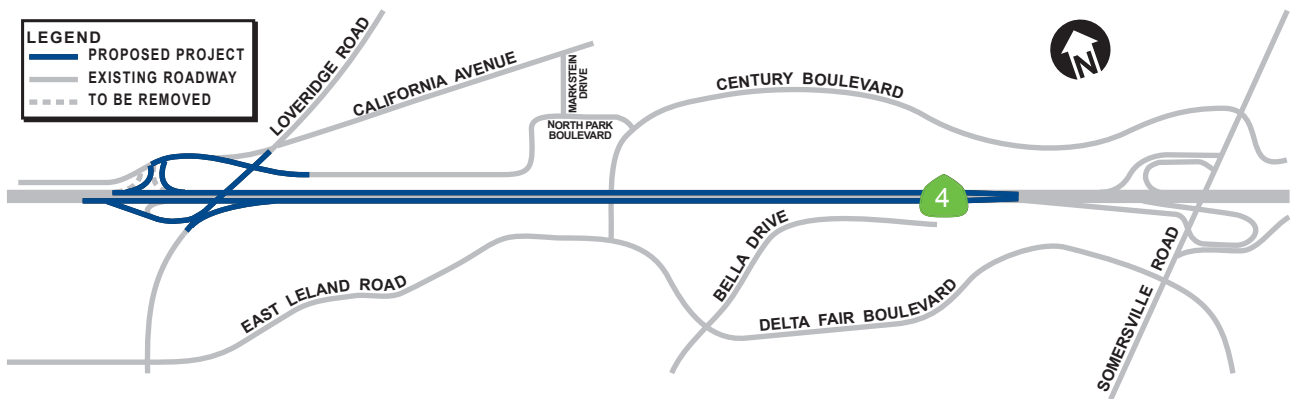

interchange. The project includes reconstruction of the Loveridge Road interchange as well as a median wide enough to accommodate future mass transit.

Need/Purpose

The project will reduce traffic congestion on State Route 4 by providing two additional through lanes and will increase the use of carpool lanes on State Route 4. Once complete, the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) network on State Route 4 will extend from State Route 242 to east of the Loveridge Road Interchange. The project will also accommodate future mass transit in the median and improve safety.

Current Status

Construction of a new drainage pump station, a UPRR Team Track (cargo transfer) Facility and major PG&E utility relocations are all complete. Construction of the State Route 4 mainline widening and Loveridge Road Interchange reconstruction began in June 2010. The project construction will be completed approximately in late 2013 or early 2014 depending on weather and contractor's approved working schedule. The construction staging and duration is significantly affected by environmental permit restrictions associated with existing creeks and waterways within the project limits.
