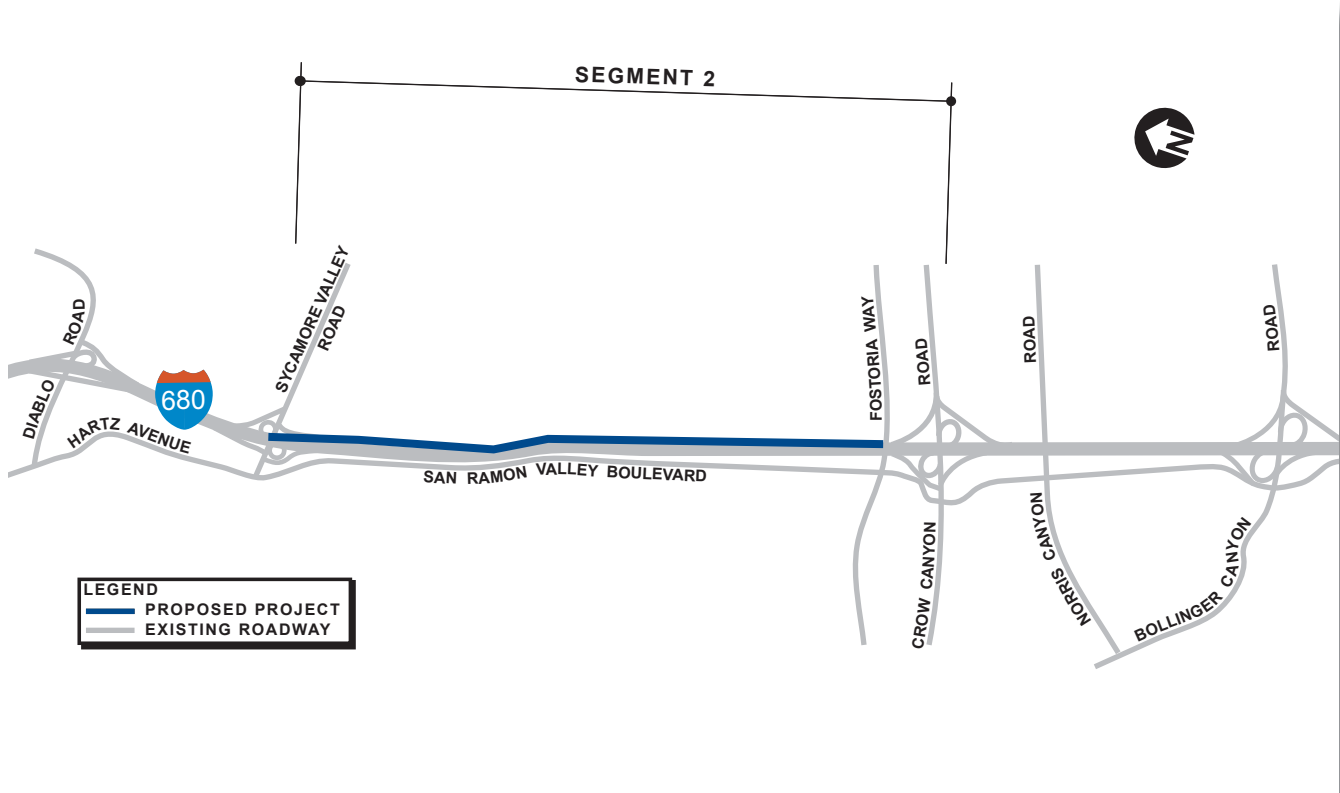




# I-680 Auxiliary Lanes - Sycamore Valley Road to Crow Canyon Road (Segment 2)

## Project Scope

Construct auxiliary lanes in the I-680 corridor from Crow Canyon Road in San Ramon to Sycamore Valley Road in Danville. These improvements include an additional 12-foot lane and 12-foot wide shoulder between interchanges in the northbound and southbound directions, retaining walls, new soundwalls, and replacement landscaping in the corridor.

## I-680 Auxiliary Lanes-Sycamore Valley Road To Crow Canyon Road (Segment 2) (cont.)

### Need/Purpose

The purpose of the project is to improve overall freeway performance and enhance commuter capacity by relieving congestion due to merging and weaving. Accident rates should improve in this segment of the freeway due mainly to weaving and merging.

### Possible Segmentation

The auxiliary lanes can be constructed one direction at a time.

### Issues

Project has substantial funding shortfall.

### Project Opposition / Support

The project is supported by the Town of Danville and the City of San Ramon. There is no known Public opposition.

### Current Status

The project was environmentally cleared in September 2002. The project report was approved in February 2003.

Segments 1 and 3 have been constructed. Final design for Segment 2 will start in early 2011.
