1	Operating Funding for Low Income Access to Health Care (Route 200): Replaces funding previously provided by Contra Costa Health Services to continue Route 200 service for East County Residents who depend on transit for access to County health care and social service facilities.	ECCTA (Tri-Delta Transit)	\$ 276,000
2	Monument Community Shuttle: Funds operation of a new shuttle service within the Monument Corridor, with access to a local health care clinic, shopping, and service to Sun Valley Mall at a discounted fare. Passengers can transfer from the shuttle to County Connection's #980 to reach County health and other services in Martinez.	City of Concord with County Connection (CCCTA)	\$ 524,512
3	CCCTA Route 111 Weekend Service: Reinstates discontinued weekend bus service between the Concord and the Pleasant Hill BART stations, traversing through the center of the Monument Corridor, providing access to non-traditional employment, shopping, church, and BART.	CCCTA	\$ 314,712
4	Low-Income Middle School Student Bus Pass Gap Closure Project: Provides free monthly bus passes to 660 middle school students of the lowest-income households within the West Contra Costa Unified School District.	WCCTAC	\$ 183,750
5	Continued Service on Line #376, City of Richmond: Contributes partial funding to sustain 365 day-per-year late night service (8:30 p.m. to 3:30 a.m.) on the #376 bus route, serving Richmond and North Richmond. The route provides late night shift workers with access to employment centers, plus connections to BART and AC Transit.	AC Transit	\$1,100,000
